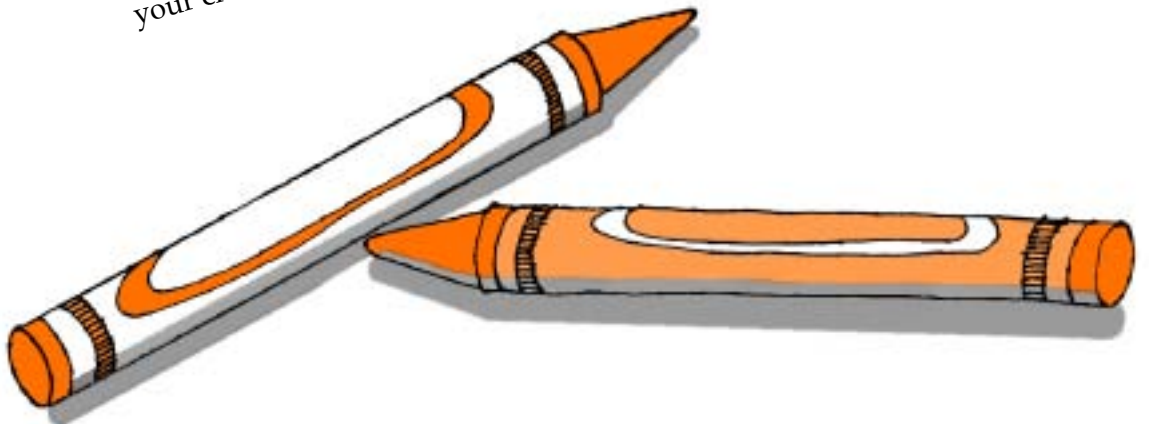
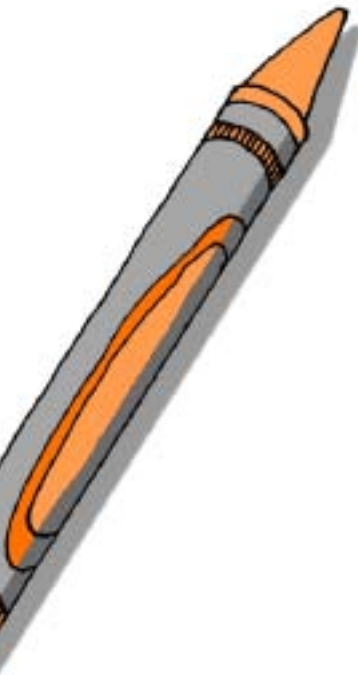
Your students will be delighted with the things to do in this *Early Elementary Make-It/Take-It* book. It contains a variety of activities that are simple enough to be done by the children in your class, with very little help from the teacher. Use your discretion in deciding whether or not to punch out the perforated projects before class. Many of your children may enjoy punching out their own projects. You may need to have tape handy to repair an occasional tear; but by letting children do their own work, you're allowing them to feel the satisfaction of completing a project themselves.

Each project reinforces the lesson by reviewing the Bible story or by showing the children how to apply what they learned in that day's lesson. The children can take their projects home at the end of the class period and continue reviewing what they are learning as they show their families what they made.

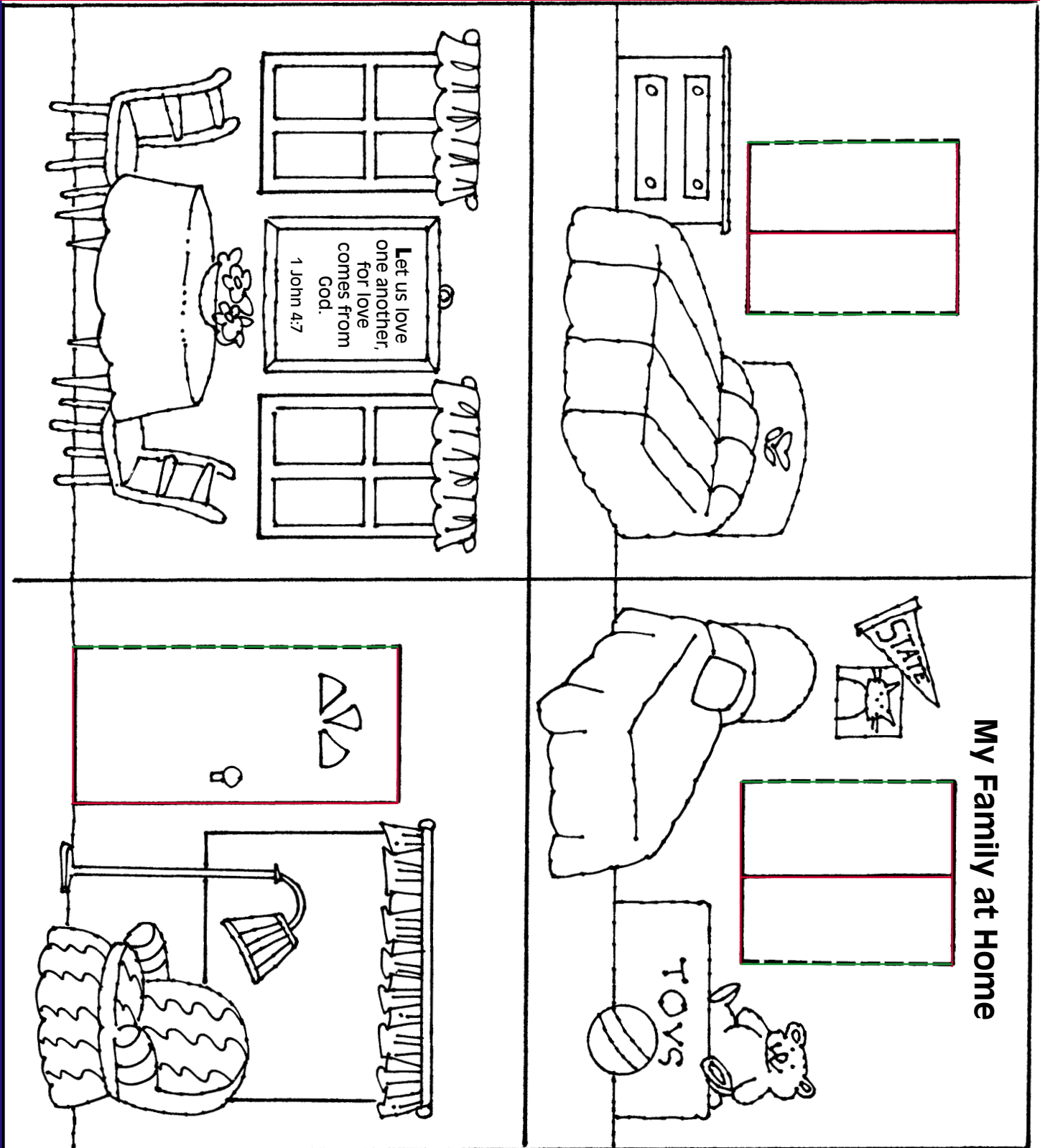

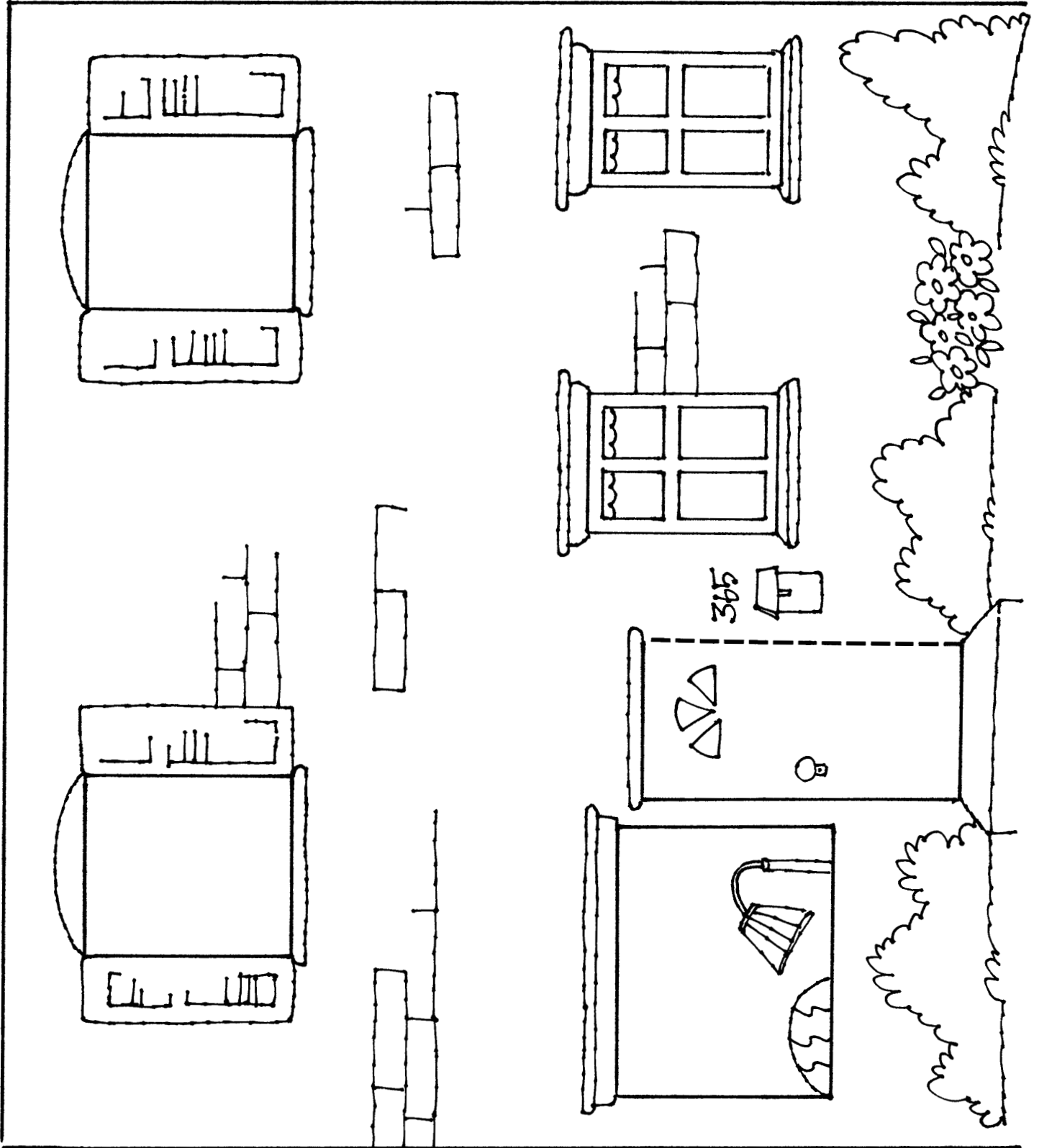
To have on hand: crayons, construction paper, cotton balls, teacher's scissors, children's scissors; glue or glue sticks (the sticks are not as messy as glue); yarn, tape, paper fasteners, craft sticks, colored pencils, vegetable oil

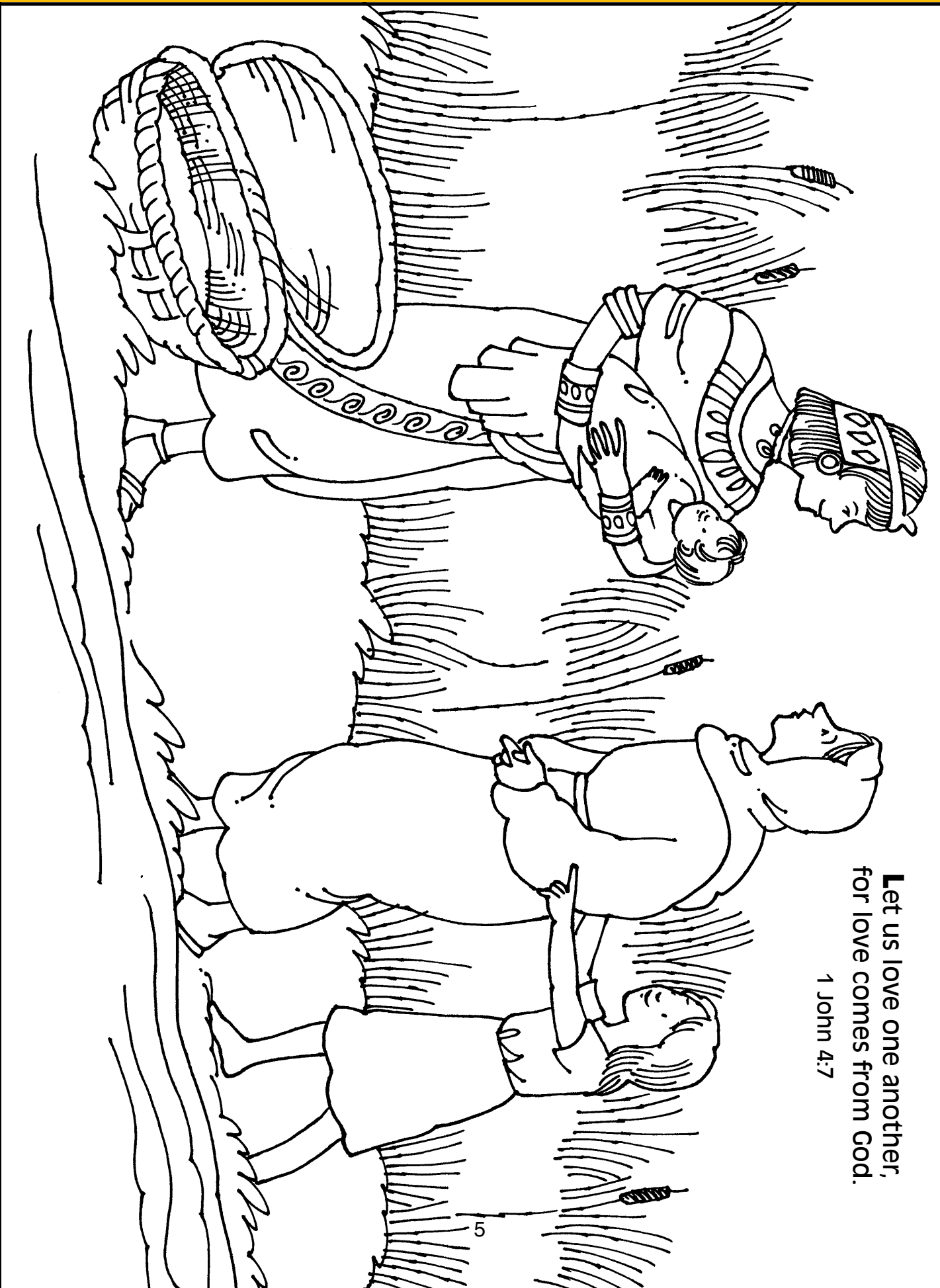
Optional: watercolor paints, paintbrushes, containers of water. paper towels, paint smocks or old shirts to protect clothing (Lessons 1, 7, 10); paper plates (Lesson 3); envelopes or resealable plastic sandwich bags and craft sticks (Lesson 4); instant camera and film (Lesson 5); dried leaves, small twigs, feathers (Early Bird Option for Lesson 7); fabric scraps (Lesson 8); list of people in your church who need prayer, envelopes, yellow felt (Lesson 12)



- Before class, remove the margins and open the die-cut door and windows.
- Fold the door and windows back.
- Put the project pages out with pencils, crayons, and markers.
- Let the children draw their family members in the different rooms of the house, then color both sides of the page.
